Agrology is the practice of bio-resource and economics sciences to provide advice to the agriculture, agrifood and environmental resources sector and contribute to the health of society, environment and economy. The Ontario Institute of Agrologists (OIA) was established over 50 years ago and is comprised of accredited practicing professionals. Today, we operate under an amended 2013 Ontario Institute of Professional Agrologists Act of the provincial legislature. There is an Institute of Agrology in each Canadian province and a network of over 10,000 licensed professionals across Canada. Like all registered professions under a provincial Act, accredited Agrologists adhere to a Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice, and serve society through public accountability.

The mission of the OIA is to serve as an independent third party and protect the public by ensuring the competence of practitioner members in Ontario. Our members serve to build public confidence in Ontario's agriculture, environmental remediation, agri-life science, agri-business, and agri-food system.
